



# Dojang Rules

## KMAA Policies

- All visitors to KMAA premises (staff, students, and spectators) must comply with all KMAA Policies, available at [www.kmaa.com.au/resources](http://www.kmaa.com.au/resources)

## Respect

- KMAA expects all staff, students and spectators to be respectful of each other. Bullying or harassment will not be tolerated.

## Taekwondo Etiquette & Respect

- Students should always bow:
  - When entering or leaving the Dojang (training area).
  - At the commencement and end of each class.
  - When instructed to bow by the Instructor.
  - When finishing practicing with a partner.
- When fixing your belt or adjusting your dobok, do not face your instructor; turn your back to the instructor out of respect.
- Students should show respect for all elements of their martial arts training.
- Students must treat their belts with respect, and ensure they wear the correct belt.

## Use of KMAA Skills

- KMAA teaches Taekwondo skills for self-defence purposes only, not for aggression.

## Presentation

- Students should come to KMAA in a clean, pressed dobok (uniform).
- All students must have clean and short fingernails and toenails for the safety of other students in the class.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- No jewellery is to be worn in class; this includes watches. Stud earrings and plain wedding bands are exempt.

## Representing KMAA

- While wearing our uniform, staff and students must understand they are representing KMAA to the broader community, and should align behaviour with KMAA standards.
- We ask that all members of our KMAA community show respect online (including social media platforms).
